



## PRO

Signed a contract extension with the Bills on August 30, 2013 ... Drafted with the team's second pick in the first round of the 2009 NFL Draft (28th overall)...first player taken by the Bills from Louisville in the first round.

### 2015

- Vs. IND (9/13): Started at center in his 80th career game... helped pave the way for 147 yards rushing by the team
- Vs. NE (9/20): Started at center...cleared the path for 160 yards rushing on the day
- At MIA (9/27): Started at center...cleared the path for 160 yards rushing on the day...led the offensive line that cleared the way for 151 rushing yards and kept QB Tyrod Taylor from being sacked
- Vs. NYG (10/4): Started at center for the Bills
- At TEN (10/11): Started at center and helped clear a path for QB Tyrod Taylor to set a franchise record for quarterbacks with 76 yards rushing.
- Vs. CIN (10/18): Started at center...helped clear a path for 112 yards rushing and two touchdowns on the day.
- At JAX (10/25): Started at center....helped block for 115 rushing yards.

### 2014

- Started 16 games at center for the second consecutive season. Helped anchor offensive line that guided the Bills to seven rushing touchdowns
- Selected by his teammates as a team captain for the 2014 season--marking the second consecutive season he has been chosen for the honor.
- At CHI (9/7): Started at center for an offensive line that only allowed one sack and blocked for a rushing attack that tallied 197 yards
- Vs. MIA (9/14): Started at center for an offensive line that allowed no sacks and paved the way for the Bills to gain over 100 yards rushing for the second consecutive game
- Vs. SD (9/21): Started at center for the 20th straight game, the longest streak of his career
- At HOU (9/28): Started at center...paved the way for the Bills rushing attack to average 4.2 yards per carry
- At DET (10/5): Started at center...led an offensive line that paved the way for Fred Jackson to average 4.9 yards per rush
- Vs. NE (10/12): Started at center...cleared the way for Fred Jackson's first rushing touchdown of the season
- Vs. MIN (10/19): Started his 70th career game...captained an offensive line that gained a season-best 6.2 yards per rush
- At NYJ (10/26): Started at center...led the way for Frank Summers' one-yard touchdown run
- Vs. KC (11/9): Started at center...blocked for Boobie Dixon, who averaged a season-best 6.9 yards per carry
- At MIA (11/13): Started at center...held a top pass rushing defense in Miami to just two sacks of QB Kyle Orton

## Wood, Eric

### 2013

- Started all 16 games for the first time in his career. Helped block for just the second Bills running back duo in franchise history to exceed 800 yards a piece on the ground.
- Selected as a team captain by his teammates, marking the first time in his career having received the recognition.
- vs. NE (9/8): Started at center for an offensive line that did not allow a sack and blocked for a rushing attack that tallied 136 yards.
- vs. CAR (9/15): Started at center on an offensive line that blocked for a rushing attack that tallied 149 yards, including a 103 yard performance from RB C.J. Spiller.
- at NYJ (9/22): Started at center, the 50th start and game played of his career.
- vs. BAL (9/29): Started at center, blocking for a rushing attack that tallied 203 yards and a touchdown--the first rushing TD allowed by the Ravens this season.
- at CLE (10/3): Started at center, blocking for a rushing attack that totaled 155 yards and three scores.
- vs. CIN (10/13): Started at center, blocking for a rushing attack that tallied 130 yards and a score ... Rushing attack accounted for at least 120 yards for the sixth consecutive week.
- at MIA (10/20): Started at center
- at NO (10/27): Started at center, his 55th career start and game played
- vs. KC (11/3): Started at center, part of an offensive line that did not give up a sack or quarterback hit and blocked for a rushing attack that recorded a season-high 241 yards on the ground.
- at PIT (11/10): Started at center
- vs. NYJ (11/17): Started at center along an offensive line that only allowed one sack.
- vs. ATL (12/1): Started at center along an offensive line that did not give up a sack and blocked for a rushing attack that totaled 195 yards and three scores.
- at TB (12/8): Started at center
- at JAX (12/15): Started at center, blocking for a ground game that registered 198 yards and a score.
- vs. MIA (12/22): Started at left guard, blocking for a rushing attack that totaled 203 yards and a score in addition to only allowing one sack.

### 2012

- Started all 14 games he played ... part of an offensive line that held opponents to 30 sacks (fifth fewest in the AFC), while blocking for a rushing attack that averaged 138.6 yards per game -- second in the AFC.
- at NYJ (9/9), started at center and helped block for a rushing attack that amassed 195 yards, including a career-high 169 yards by RB C.J. Spiller ... offense did not allow a sack
- vs. KC (9/16), started at center and helped block for a rushing attack that gained 201 yards and offense did not allow a sack for the second straight week... second time in team history the offensive line held opponents to zero sacks in the first two games of a season (1980)
- at Cle. (9/23), started at center and was part of an offensive attack that accounted for 344 yards, including 138 rushing... offense has surrendered just one sack this season, came on a fumble by QB R. Fitzpatrick when the ball slipped out of his hand and he wasn't touched by a defender
- vs. NE (9/30), started at center, part of an offense that produced 438 yards of offense
- at SF (10/7), started at center, part of an offense that only allowed one sack throughout the contest
- at Ari. (10/14), started at center and helped pave the way for 165 yards on the ground
- vs. Ten. (10/21), started at center, his 40th career start, and helped lead a rushing attack that amassed 166 yards
- at Hou. (11/4), started at center and helped offense produced 308 yards of total offense
- at NE (11/11), started at center... part of an offense that produced season bests of 481 total yards and a time of

possession of 33:50

- vs. Mia. (11/15), started at center, part of an offense that produced 120 yards on the ground

- vs. JAX. (12/2), started at center, part of an offense that produced 232 rushing yards and did not give up a sack... left the game late in the fourth quarter with a knee injury and did not return
- vs. StL (12/9) and vs. Sea. (12/16), Inactive with a knee injury
- at Mia. (12/23), returned to the line up after missing two games and started at center, offense produced 381 net yards, including 154 on the ground
- vs. NYJ (12/30), started at center, offense produced 334 net yards, and did not allow a sack

### 2011

- Part of offense that allowed a league-best 23 sacks in 2011 and ranked fifth in the NFL (first in the AFC) with 4.9 yards per rush.
- 23 sacks allowed are the third-fewest in a Bills 16-game season
- Made his first Kickoff Weekend start at Center at KC (9/11) after transitioning to the position in 2010... anchored an offensive line the yielded 1.0 sack to the Chiefs and produced 163 rushing yards
- Anchored an offensive line that did not allow a sack to the Raiders (9/18) and blocking for 217 rushing yards
- vs. NE (9/25), started at center for an offensive line that did not allow a sack and offense gained 448 net yards
- at CIN (10/2): Started at center, has started all 28 games he has played
- vs. PHI (10/9): started at center and helped block for rushing attack that tallied 143 yards ... held the then-NFL leading sack defense to one sack
- at NYG (10/16): started at center and helped block for a rushing attack that tallied 155 yards on 23 attempts
- vs. WAS (10/30): started at center, helped block for rushing game that produced 138 yards and RB Fred JAXkson's third straight 100-yard game and fifth this season
- vs. NYJ (11/6): started at C, offense did not allow a sack
- at DAL (11/13): started at C, before leaving the game with an injury ... Helped limit Dallas to one sack

### 2010

- Played and started 14 games, including four at center
- vs. MIA (9/12) Started his second-consecutive Kickoff Weekend game... game marked his return to the playing field since suffering a season-ending injury against Jacksonville in 2009 (Week 11)
- at NE (9/26) Started at right guard... member of an offensive line helping pave the way for a season-best 134 yards rushing
- at BAL (10/24) Started at right guard... part of an offensive line that blocked for 506 yards of offense while limiting the Ravens' defense to one sack
- vs. CHI (11/7) Made his eighth start of the year at right guard... part of an offensive line that held the Bears' defense to 1.0 sack
- vs. DET (11/14) Made 19th career starter... part of an offensive line that blocked for RB Fred JAXkson's season-best 133 rushing yards, while holding the Lions' defense to 1.0 sack for the second straight week
- at CIN (11/21) Started the 10th game of the season, and 20th of his career, at right guard... left the game in the third quarter due to a knee injury and did not return
- vs. PIT (11/28), at MIN (12/5) Inactive

- vs. CLE (12/12) Made first career start at center, anchoring an offensive line that paved the way for a season-best 192 rushing yards on 42 carries (4.2 avg.)
- at MIA (12/19) Made his second straight start at center in place of Geoff Hangartner
- vs. NE (12/26) Started and played at center in place of C Geoff Hangartner for the third straight game
- at NYJ (1/2) Started at center for the fourth consecutive game

### 2009

- At NE (9/14): Made NFL debut, starting at RG... joined fellow 2009 draft selection LG Andy Levitre as the first two true rookies to start for the team in a season-opener since 1970 (9/20/70 vs. DEN)... joined fellow rookie, LG A. Levitre and 1st-year player LT D. Bell, as the first three offensive linemen to start a game for a team without playing in an NFL game since the 1981 Washington Redskins... provided critical lead block along with C Geoff Hangartner on a RB Fred JAXkson 3rd-and-15 conversion in the fourth quarter on a series producing a touchdown.
- Vs. TB (9/20): Started for the second straight week at RG... helped pave the way for RB Fred JAXkson's 163 yards rushing performance.
- At JAX (11/22): Started his 10th game at RG... left the game with a leg injury.
- Placed on Injured Reserve on November 24, 2009.

### COLLEGE

Consecutive start string of 49 ranked second in school history...49 starts were the sixth-longest streak among active NCAA players...For his career, Wood registered 328 knockdowns and 46 touchdown-resulting blocks... allowed just two quarterback pressures and one sack on 882 pass plays. 2008: All-American third-team choice by The NFL Draft Report... All-Big East Conference first-team selection... Finalist for the Rimington Trophy, given to the nation's premier center... Started all 12 games at center...recorded 78 knockdowns and 16 touchdown-resulting blocks...Did not allow any quarterback sacks or pressures on 391 pass plays. 2007: All-Big East Conference first-team selection...Started all 12 games at center...Registered 86 knockdowns...Allowed one quarterback sack and two pressures on 491 pass plays. 2006: Received All-Big East Conference second-team honors, as he started all thirteen games at center...member of the Rimington Trophy Watch List...Delivering 79 knockdowns for a unit that ranked second in the nation in total offense. 2005: Freshman All-American first-team selection by Rivals.com and The Sporting News...earned second-team honors from College Football News...Academic All-Big East Conference recognition...Moved into the starting lineup at center, leading the team with 85 knockdowns. 2004: Redshirted as a freshman.
